I. About the Project:

Mediterranean Youth for Creative Impact (MED-Y.C.I) is a 30-month project funded by the EU under the Interreg NEXT MED Programme.

Led by **Les Têtes de l'Art** (France) in partnership with **Anna Lindh Foundation** (Egypt), **IEMed** (Spain), **CILG** (Tunisia) and **Pi Youth Association** (Türkiye), the project supports **young people** aged **18-30** to develop creative, digital, and civic skills that strengthen their employability and active participation in society.

Through innovative training programmes, creative studios, and hands-on youth-led actions, MED-Y.C.I offers young people the tools, space, and confidence to turn ideas into impact while contributing to more inclusive and sustainable communities across the Mediterranean.

The **MED-Y.C.I** programme combines creative skill development, civic engagement, and youth-led social innovation. Through hands-on learning and collaborative production, participants strengthen their digital and creative capacities while exploring how young people can contribute to positive change in their communities.



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II. Call For Application:

In this context, MED-Y.C.I is launching a call for applications for **200 young people aged 18–30** from the [eligible cooperation areas of the program](#) of **France, Spain, Türkiye, Tunisia, and Egypt** (40 participants per country).

Selected participants will join an innovative learning programme combining **audiovisual storytelling, digital creativity, and critical thinking**, through workshops, peer exchange, and experimentation in MED-Y.C.I Studios.

Through hands-on learning and collaborative production, participants will develop practical skills that strengthen their employability and respond to youth unemployment and evolving job-market needs.

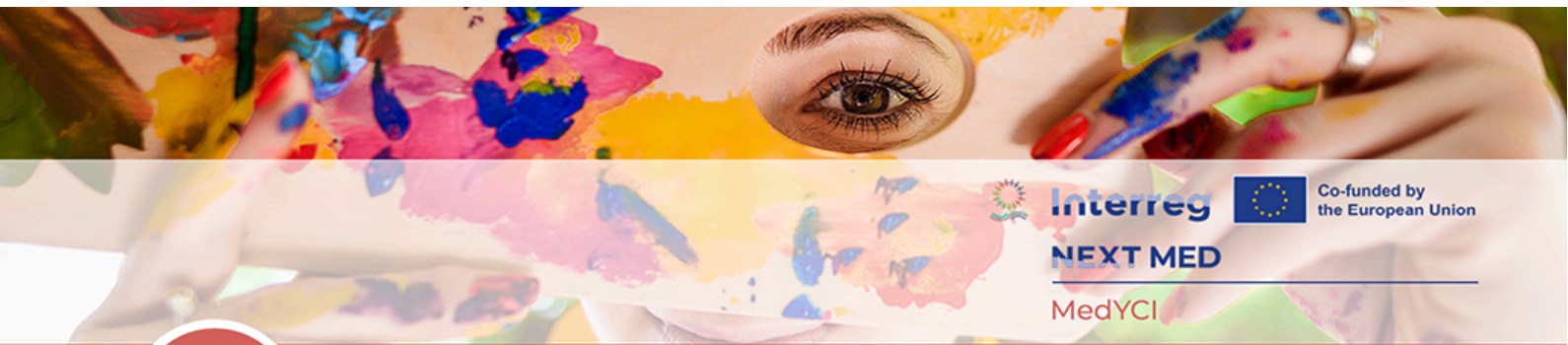
Participants will also strengthen their creative and digital capacities while exploring how young people can contribute to positive change in their communities through civic engagement and, where relevant, regional advocacy initiatives.

No previous audiovisual or technical experience is required. This call values motivation, curiosity, and willingness to learn and collaborate.

Objectives of the Learning Programme:

The Learning Programme aims to:

- Strengthening creative and storytelling skills and soft skills
- Develop digital and audiovisual competencies
- Encourage intercultural exchange across the Mediterranean
- Support collaborative learning and peer exchange
- Enable young people to engage in social and civic topics
- Build a network of active young people across the Mediterranean



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Practical Informations

The MED-Y.C.I programme is structured in two main phases:

Phase 1 – Co-Design & Identification of Key Mediterranean Challenges (April–May 2026)

This first phase will take place through online working groups and one face-to-face co-creation lab per country (5 participants per country).

During this phase, selected participants will:

- Identify and prioritise key Mediterranean challenges to be addressed through the training;
- Collaborate with experts and artists;
- Contribute to shaping the pedagogical content of the Med-Y.C.I training pathway.

Phase 2 – Med-Y.C.I National Training Cycles (from Summer 2026 onwards)

Five national Med-Y.C.I training cycles will be implemented across France, Spain, Türkiye, Tunisia, and Egypt, engaging over 200 young participants.

- Each national cycle will include three complementary dimensions:
- Collaboration with experts to analyse and respond to Mediterranean challenges;
- Peer-to-peer transnational exchanges to formulate strategic recommendations
- Creative workshops to express ideas through media, audiovisual and digital production.
- These sessions aim to strengthen civic engagement as a transversal and valuable skill, enhancing both employability and active citizenship.

Location & Mobility

Most training modules will take place locally in each partner country.



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However, as part of an international Mediterranean network, selected participants may have opportunities to take part in transnational exchanges, mobility activities, or regional events, depending on project developments and engagement level.

Financial Conditions

Participation in the MED-Y.C.I programme is entirely free of charge.

All core programme costs are covered by the project, including:

- Training activities
- Access to MED-Y.C.I Studios
- Mentorship by experts and artists
- Participation in official project activities

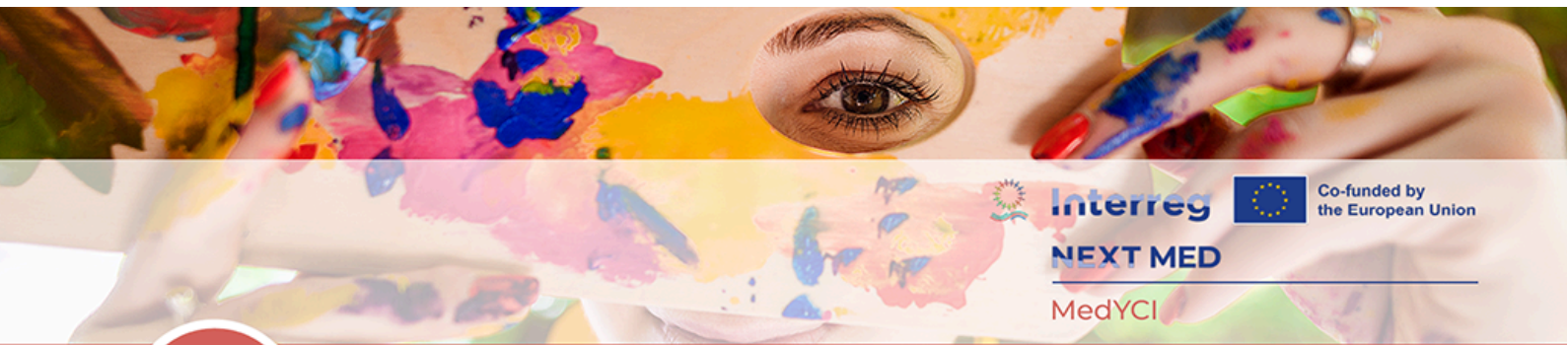
Where mobility or international participation is foreseen, travel, accommodation and related costs will be covered according to programme rules.

No participation fee is required.

Applicants must:

- Be between 18 to 30 years old.
- Be residents of one of the following Euromeds Regions :



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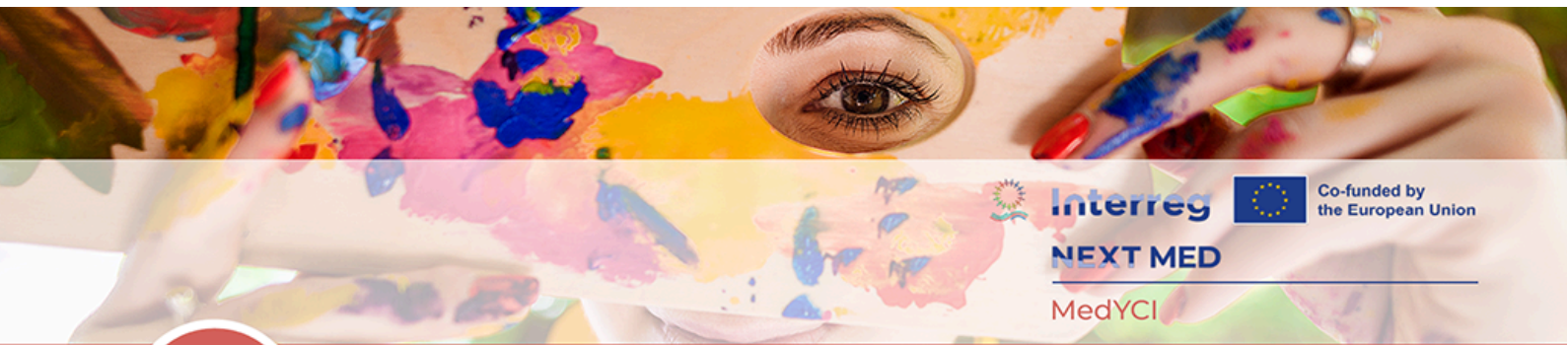

We are looking for young people who are:

- Motivated to learn, co-create, and collaborate with young people from across the Mediterranean.
- Open to intercultural dialogue, diversity, and exchange of ideas.
- Interested in creativity, including media, digital production, or creative approaches to civic engagement.
- Willing to participate in project activities and contribute to group learning.
- Interested in civic engagement and, where relevant, regional advocacy initiatives.

We highly encourage applications from young people with diverse educational backgrounds, non-linear professional paths, informal learning experiences, and limited access to opportunities, including individuals from diverse socio-economic contexts and those from NEET backgrounds.

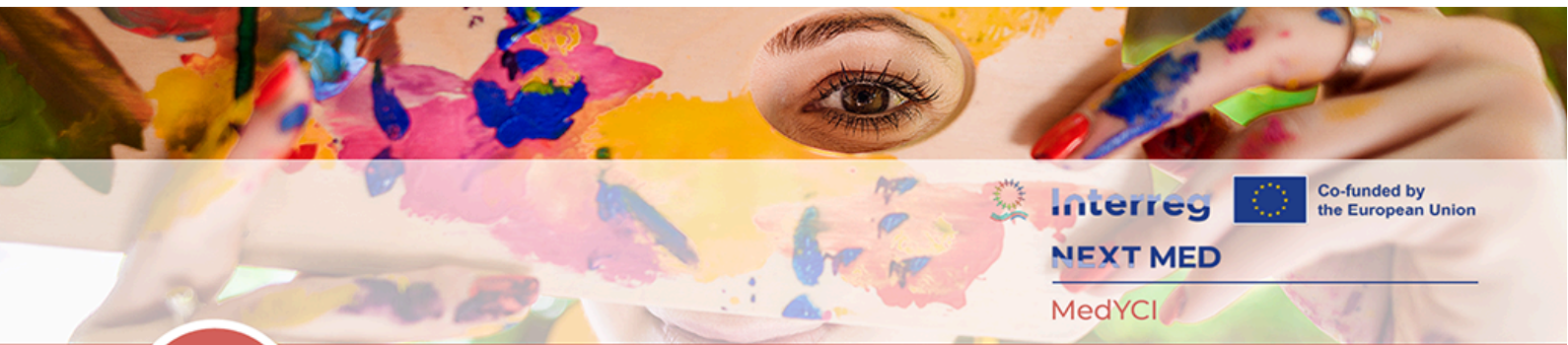
- Be part of a Mediterranean Youth Network
- Gain hands-on experience in media, digital production, and creative tools through MED-Y.CI Studios
- Be guided and mentored by experts, trainers, and artists from the Mediterranean region
- Learn through peer-to-peer exchange and collaborative work with young people from five countries
- Develop and produce impactful audiovisual and digital content
- Strengthen key skills including digital skills, creativity, communication, leadership, and intercultural dialogue and soft skills
- Have the opportunity to design and implement your own youth-led initiatives and projects
- Engage in civic engagement activities and contribute to social and civic conversations across the Mediterranean, including regional advocacy activities, where relevant.
- Participate in the MED'Action Festival and other visibility opportunities, where applicable.

Commitment & Expected Involvement

Participation in MED-Y.C.I requires genuine commitment and active engagement throughout the different phases of the programme.

By applying, candidates agree to:

- Participate in the initial online working groups (April–May 2026);
- Attend and actively engage in the national in-person training sessions;
- Be present for the full duration of selected training modules.



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Participants are expected to:

- Contribute actively during workshops and collaborative sessions;
- Engage in creative production and group work;
- Participate in peer-learning activities;
- Contribute to collective outputs such as audiovisual content, recommendations, or youth-led initiatives.

The core training participation is mandatory and additional involvement in communication, dissemination activities, festivals, or regional events may be proposed and remains optional depending on availability and interest.

Participants may have the opportunity to:

- Contribute to strategic recommendations addressed to Mediterranean stakeholders;
- Participate in creative youth-led actions;
- Engage in visibility events or public discussions;
- Take part in regional advocacy initiatives where relevant.

MED-Y.C.I values responsibility, reliability and collective spirit as key components of the learning experience.

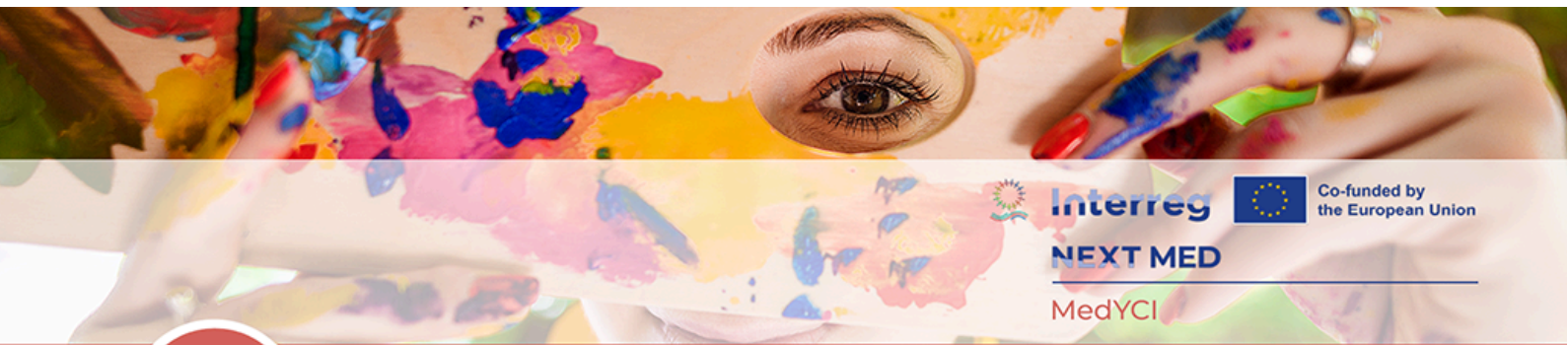

Applications will be reviewed by the project partners in each country.

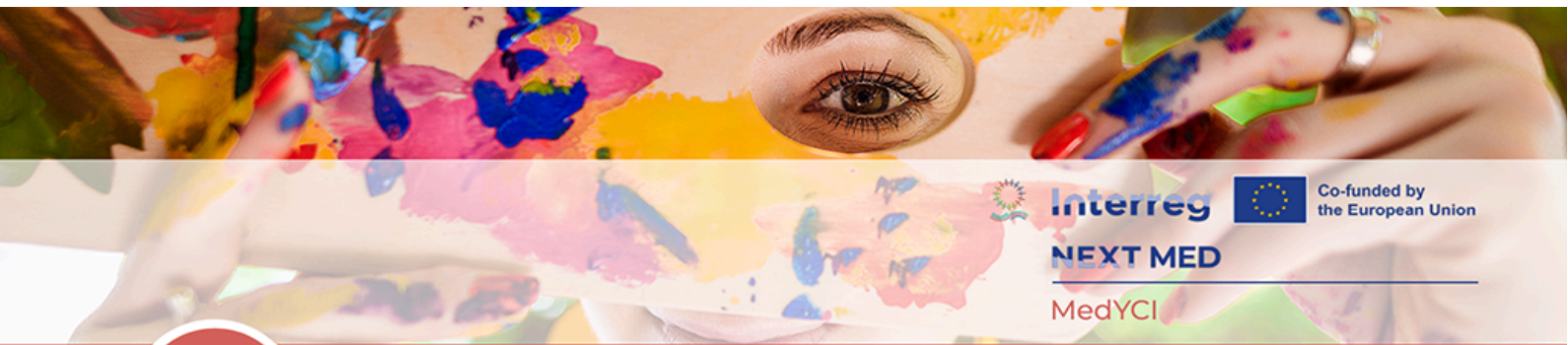
All formats (video, written, audio, or creative submissions) will be assessed using the same evaluation criteria. The technical quality of the submission will not be assessed.
